



26th ANNUAL BLUE RIDGE WRITERS' CONFERENCE

April 14 & 15, 2023

The Mission of the Blue Ridge Writers' Conference is to educate, inform, and inspire writers. No matter the level of expertise, the Blue Ridge Writers' Conference provides a venue for professional writers, editors and agents to provide honest and accurate feedback to the aspiring writer in how to craft that first novel, sell a magazine article, market yourself in the literary world, or find inspiration for your poetry. Previous keynote speakers include a number of well-known writers such as novelist Claire Cook, Terry Kay, mystery writers Patricia Sprinkle, Joshilyn Jackson and Sharyn McCrumb, essayists James Kilgo and Steven Harvey, suspense writer Karin Slaughter, and former Georgia poet laureate, David Bottoms.

Saturday, April 15th begins with light breakfast fare and our keynote speech, *Breathing Life and Lives into Fiction*, by Annette Saunooke Clapsaddle. Annette Saunooke Clapsaddle, a citizen of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, resides in Qualla, NC. She holds degrees from Yale University and the College of William and Mary. Her debut novel, *Even As We Breathe* (UPK 2020), was a finalist for the Weatherford Award, named one of NPR's Best Books of 2020, and received the Thomas Wolfe Memorial Literary Award (2021). It also is the first novel published by a citizen of the Eastern Band of Cherokee. Ms. Clapsaddle's work appears in *Yes! Magazine*, *Lit Hub*, *Our State Magazine*, and *The Atlantic*. Ms. Clapsaddle teaches secondary English and Cherokee Studies, is an editor for the Appalachian Futures Series (UPK), and serves on the board of trustees for the North Carolina Writers Network.

The day continues with concurrent workshops on everything from Fiction and Non-Fiction to Poetry and marketing a manuscript. Our 2023 speakers include a wide variety of fiction, non-fiction, and poetry writers. Conference attendees appreciate the chance to network with other writers and speakers during the day and the opportunity to submit their work for critique by one of the conference speakers.

The Blue Ridge Writers' Conference also offers a four-hour Workshop Intensive on Friday, April 14th. For an additional fee, the Workshop Intensive provides a more concentrated workshop to strengthen and inspire your literary endeavors. Novelist and poet, Dana Wildsmith, will lead our 2023 workshop entitled *Writing Through Change*. Wildsmith's writing has its roots in literal soil: the earth of the old farm she works to keep alive, as documented in her collection of poems, *One Good Hand*, and through her environmental memoir, *Back to Abnormal*, or along the desert sands of our southern border, as told in her novel, *Jumping*, a story which grew from Wildsmith's work as a teacher of English Literacy to non-native speakers. Wildsmith has a new book forthcoming which took root as the pandemic flourished and we all searched for tools to help us cope with this unprecedented epic. *With Access to Tools* explores the role of tools in our lives: traditional farm tools, tools of the digital age, and cerebral tools such as patience and memory. Wildsmith is a highly sought-after teacher of creative writing and has garnered residencies at the Hambidge Center, the Lillian E Smith Center, Grand Canyon National Park and Everglades National Park.

If you are an author and have registered for the conference, you may sign up with the Art Center to have your books for sale on Friday evening during the reception and on Saturday during the conference until 3:00pm.
